Nicaragua Reports: One mini and one regular campaign—27 baptisms, 5 restored; 2 weekends—32 baptisms plus 17 restored; follow-up—21 baptized and 5 restored; personal work—5 baptized and 1 restored. Totals: 85 baptisms; 28 restored.

Honduras Reports: 2 campaigns—26 baptisms, plus 7 reconciled; weekends—19 baptisms and 10 restorations. Total—45 baptisms and 17 reconciled.

GUATEMALA CITY *REPORT OF RESULTS OF MARCH 2012:*

NATIONAL LECTURESHIP OF THE COC IN GUATEMALA: Like you know, every year the church in Guatemala is making this big activity like an effort of unity of the church in the country. The cooperation of BICA in the Lectureship is very important every year. BICA helps one week before the lectureship presenting the gospel house by house, and also BICA helps in the Lectureship building the big tent for the services, arranging more than 3,000 chairs, in charge of the baptisms during the lectureship etc. On this year the Lectureship was in a small town named Xejuyup (Xejuyup means in Mayan language: town under the mountains). The attendance was of 3,100 brethren from all the country. For the glory of God since BICA is involved in the lectureship the number of conversions is increased. The students of BICA were working in Xejuyup since March 27th – to the end of the Lectureship on April 7th
