Let me introduce you to Francela Bellorina. Francela is finishing her first year at BICA Nicaragua. She celebrated her 15th birthday this year while at BICA.

Francela has only finished the 7th grade. She wanted to take two years off from school to come to BICA so as to become a better servant for the Lord. She plans to finish school after next year's study.

Francela is a very interesting girl. In some ways, she looks like a 15 year old. But in others, she seems older.

Francela was abandoned by her father when she was three. She was raised by her mother along with three other

siblings...three brothers and a sister.

When she was nine, she was raped while walking home from school.

40 days ago, she buried her 12 year old brother whom she describes as her "twin in spirit". He had expressed a desire to be baptized, but decided to wait until November because BICA would be having a campaign in the area. He died of a heart attack. Francela was crushed.

BICA had a campaign scheduled in another town just a few days after the funeral. Erick told her to take all the time she needed to be with her family. She responded that she had buried her brother and there was nothing more she could do for him. She had work to do for the Lord. She joined the campaign.

Francela is finishing her first year at BICA. Through her own personal evangelism work, 33 people have been baptized...this year. Half of those were adults more than twice her age.

REPORT OF RESULTS OF OCTOBER 2013:

Evangelistic campaign of the month in El Salvador: The churches in El Salvador always are invited BICA for help them in the work of evangelism. For this reason we are helping the churches in that country all than we can. Our goals are not only go and make evangelism, but also teach them how to present the good news. On October we were helping 5 congregations of the area of San Salvador (the capitol city of that country). The results were marvelous for the glory of God. In one week of work the students converted a total of 49 souls in the 5 places, and approximately 62 brethren were learning to present the good news to the lost.
