


## Guatemala reports from Roberto Alvarez: EVANGELISTIC CAMPAIGN OF THE MONTH IN SALCAJA:

April was a busy month with the lectureship and our monthly campaign. Salcajá is a beautiful town of the west of Guatemala, close to Quetzaltenango. The church there had before our campaign around 40 members. Thanks God and the hard work of our students 28 people were baptized in Salcaja.

They call their disciples "seeds." Eight students were ill and had to go to the hospital. Now all is well. With those difficulties, we baptized 18 and restored 6. Wednesday evangelism baptized 7, restored 2. Growing groups (house churches) baptized 4, restored 1. Erick himself baptized 3 and restored 4. Totals in Nicaragua: baptized 32, restored 12.



## **Honduras reports:**

Carlos Pineda reports good news from Honduras. The school traveled to Tegucigalpa, Honduras to conduct 5 campaigns in one week. Results—baptized 60, restored 23, Bible studies 300. Eighteen were baptized on the weekend assignments. Totals: baptized 78, restored 23. Praise the Good Lord!
