Dearest,

Greetings to you who enable. God bless you as you are a blessing to the lost. Thank you for having the heart of Jesus, that is compassion for the lost. Let's keep His focus our focus.

I just returned on January 23 from a three-week trip to Central America where I taught evangelism in each of the three schools, one week each. God blessed us with a little over 100 students. We are waiting for three Cubans to arrive in Nicaragua. This year promises to be exciting and fruitful. Please keep on with your prayers and support. God is using all of us working together to bring salvation to those without a shepherd.

My trip was somewhat hampered by health issues. I was plagued with dizzy spells, loss of appetite, and fatigue. Thank God, I am doing better now.

Board member James Strother accompanied me during the first week in Guatemala. He was in our yellow bus when two young guys lost control of their motorbike, only to crash directly into the front of the bus. It was 100% their fault. They went to the hospital. Alberto, Assistant Director and bus driver, went to jail for about four days. He was released after we paid officers, lawyers, and bail. The police are supposed to release the bus soon, after thieves have removed parts. Welcome to Central America!

Brother James was also in class all week, plus he went with me to a church located about two hours from the school. I taught evangelism two hours a night for two nights. This added twelve hours to our week. It was worth it! The brethren were delightful, plus we baptized two men, thanks to the power of God's Word.

Roberto Alvarez, Director in Guatemala, went with me for the week in Honduras. We were greeted with another group of motivated students. While there, a graduate, Demus Aguilar, was hit by a car while riding his motorbike. The car hit him and left. Demus lost control and hit a lady who was walking. He did all the right things. He attended to the lady, called the police, and called an ambulance. He was rewarded by being thrown in jail. Demus is loved by all. The churches collected some of the money to get his release. This is business as usual. Also, we were able to give our directors some concepts to enhance their leadership.

In BICA Nicaragua, we continued with the theme to promote excellence (Phil. 1:10). The lost deserve an excellent presentation of the Gospel. We motivate students by showing what will happen in their lives if they abide by New Testament principles. We used an 18-year-old student as an example. If he lives a normal life span, he will have about 50 years of service. He should average teaching three disciples per year to present the Gospel in a very efficient way. Fifty years times three per year = 6000 years of service by just one graduate. At years' end, we should have around 500 graduates. Do the math. Our students see the vision. Pray for them. They have very few things, but they have very much faith. All to the glory of God.

Think about going with us for a campaign with the students in Nicaragua the second week of June. You WILL BE blessed!
